

As you continue your journey through the province, you'll discover other areas rich in food, wine, and natural excellence. You will be welcomed to an area that boasts the production of great DOC and DOCG wines, including **Valpolicella** and **Soave-East Verona**, and a land with a great variety of prized rice, the Vialone Nano Veronese IGP, excellence of the **Plain of the Doges**.

Without mentioning the marvellous area of **Lessinia**, famous for its trekking and cycling paths, the unique flavour of its cheeses and typical dishes at Alpine huts.

THE NEED TO MOVE

To reach us:



Land at the **Verona Valerio Catullo airport**, just 20 minutes from Verona and the lake. Take Verona Airlink or a taxi.



From **Verona Porta Nuova** train station, reach the city centre in just 20 minutes on foot.



Find parking in the section "Parcheggia Verona" of comune.verona.it

Let's explore:



From Porta Nuova, take a regional or high-speed train and **reach our lake** in just 15 minutes.



Hop on an ATV bus to explore the lake and the city. With the Verona Card, public transport in Verona is free. Check the schedules in the "Bus routes and timetables" section of atv.verona.it



Ride with **Verona Bike** along the main cycle paths connecting the city.



Get around the **lake on the Navigarda**. Find out the sailing schedule in section "Tickets and timetables Lake Garda" of navigazionelaghi.it/en/

As you can see, moving around here is simple. We recommend always moving sustainably.

Experiencing things from multiple points of view

Crossed by the **Adige River**, which gives the city a magical, romantic atmosphere, Verona is one of the most fascinating art cities in Italy. Its history stretches back more than two millennia and it is the richest - after Rome - in remains from the Roman era.


Its symbol, the Arena, hosts the world's most important opera festival — the living expression of an art that UNESCO recognized as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity in 2023.

It forms part of and oversees the **Great Wine Capitals** network, which encompasses 12 of the top cities and territories in the world of wine.

It is located in a strategic position: it is less than two hours from Milan, Venice, Bologna, the sea, and the Dolomites.

It is a **people-sized city**, almost entirely flat, except for a few panoramic points that reach an altitude of 400 m. The advantage? You can always move around sustainably!

VERONA #MYSPECIALNEEDS

Looking from above

Follow a part of the city walls on the Torricelle, which, along with the typical architecture of the centre, have allowed Verona to become a **UNESCO** World Heritage Site.

Walk up high, following the Parco delle Mura, with a must-see urban trekking path through the greenery.

Don't miss the sunset over the entire historical centre from the **Torre dei Lamberti**, where you can reach a height of more than 80 m (even via lift). From here, you can spot Verona's most symbolic landmarks right at your feet: **Piazza Erbe, Juliet's House, and Piazza dei Signori.**

Walk up to Castel San Pietro, perched on the hill overlooking the Adige River, for one of the most breathtaking views of the city.

Discover Verona with the comfortable Citysightseeing panoramic bus, get on and off all you want and admire the city from another point of view.

Looking upwards

Venture through the narrow streets in the historical centre on foot or by bicycle, crossing the historical gates of the city: Porta Borsari, Porta Nuova, Porta Palio, Porta Leoni.

As you stroll through the city, let yourself be enchanted by the elegant façades of the palaces and follow the Torre dei Lamberti with your eyes along Via Mazzini.

See how the bell tower of the city Cathedral stands out and go in to view the marvellous Assumption of the Virgin altarpiece by Titian.

Sail the Adige River together with an expert guide, passing under characteristic bridges such as Ponte Pietra and Ponte Scaligero of Castelvecchio.

Between one site and the next, take a break at the Capitolare Library, the oldest continuously operating library in the world, and then step out onto Juliet's balcony, which is just a few minutes away on foot.

Visit the city's **Civic Museums**, don't miss the exhibitions at **Palazzo Maffei** and the **Achille Forti Modern Art Gallery**.


Having fixed points




With the **Verona Card**, you have free access to the main points of interest: the Arena, Juliet's House, historical churches, Castelvecchio, and the Roman Theatre, and discounts on tickets to some monuments.

The card can be purchased online or at authorized points of sale, at IAT VERONA (Tourist Information Office in Piazza Bra), at the monument ticket offices, Porta Nuova train station, and many tourist facilities.

The first Sunday of every month, from November to March, entry to the **Verona**Civic Museums costs just €1.

The opera season at the Arena begins at June and continues throughout the summer. Since 2023, the operas Aida, La Traviata, Rigoletto, and Nabucco have been made accessible thanks to free, alternative tools.







Cultivating your passions

A paradise of water sports and outdoor activities, the ideal place for food and wine lovers, but also a cultural and artistic destination, the Veneto banks of Lake Garda are the answer for any time you want to dedicate to your passions.

Along 44 km of coastline you can discover **over 20** municipalities:

from Malcesine to Peschiera, there are many must-see lakeside towns. The ideal place for anyone looking for relaxation and tranquillity. Among the beaches, coasts, and uplands, even sports enthusiasts can make the lake their outdoor gym. Beyond the coast: in the inland areas, you can marvel at the panoramas and entirely different views up to an altitude of 2000 metres on Monte Baldo. Here, outdoor activities such as hikes, trekking, climbing, rafting, and cycling await.



Having fixed points



The lakeside municipalities are connected by **bus service** and a **ferry service**, **Navigarda**, which is available year round.

Along the Veneto shore of Lake Garda, you'll find numerous beaches, perfect for relaxing, swimming, or enjoying water sports. You can choose between fully equipped lidos or quieter spots surrounded by nature. Discover them all in the "Beaches" section of lagodigardaveneto.com

The Monte Baldo chain frames the Veneto banks and is one of the most panoramic points around the lake. You can reach 1800 meters with the innovative Malcesine cable car. This is the starting point for various trekking and mountain biking paths of different difficulty levels. The bravest can go paragliding. While in winter it is possible to ski or go snowshoeing.

You can also reach breathtaking panoramic lookouts with the Prada Costabella cable car and chairlift, both recently renovated.

This land is also home to several fascinating medieval villages, historical homes, and villas. Find time to discover the suggestive Scaliger Castles of Lazise, Torri and Malcesine, some of which can also be visited inlad.

Are you on holiday with friends, family, or your partner? Choose from more than 10 parks to find the one that is right for you! You can have fun among roller coasters and water slides, film sets for young and old, and see flowers and animals in danger of extinction. Having fixed points

Peschiera, a fortified city and UNESCO World Heritage Site, this is a small Roman village and also the starting point for the Mincio Peschiera-Mantova cycle path, the central junction of the EuroVelo 7 or 'Ciclovia del Sole'.

Valeggio sul Mincio, famous for the Scaliger Castle, Parco Giardino Sigurtà, Ponte Visconteo, and the Valeggio tortellini, territorial excellence, it is located to the south of Lake Garda, where the moraine hills open into the Mincio Valley. Just a few kilometres from here is the Terre del Custoza region, which is famous for its Custoza DOC wine. It was also the site of major historical battles, now commemorated by the Ossuary of Custoza, a suggestive monument with a breathtaking view.

The inland area on the Veneto side of Lake Garda is home to fascinating 19th-century military forts remaining from the Austro-Hungarian era. The most notable include Forte San Marco in Caprino Veronese, Forte Degenfeld in Pastrengo, and Forte Wohlgemuth in Rivoli Veronese.

The Verona shore of Lake Garda is also renowned for its festivals and village fairs, celebrating the area's typical products. The most famous include the Asparagus Festival in Rivoli Veronese, the Truffle Festival in Caprino Veronese, the Chestnut Festival in San Zeno di Montagna, the Broccoletto Festival in Custoza, and the traditional olive oil festivals. These events are a perfect opportunity to immerse yourself in local flavours and experience the authentic atmosphere of Lake Garda.



LESSINIA #MYSPECIALNEEDS

Verona's mountain

Lessinia, with its authentic flavours, trips among Alpine huts and lodges, beech forests, and large sunny pastures, is the ideal destination for trekking enthusiasts, mountain bikers, horseback riders, and all sports and nature lovers.

Continue to discover this land and stop to listen to ancient legends, tasting local cheeses (this is the area of 'Monte veronese DOP' cheese) or the obligatory gnocchi di malga from Lessinia.

Walk through the high pastures of Lessinia Regional Park and along its numerous paths in the silence of the districts.

Let yourself be enchanted with natural bridges, fossil deposits and karstic cavities, from the Spluga della Preta, one of the deepest in Italy, to the rock cities in the Valle delle Sfingi, up to the Ponte di Veja.

Try rock climbing with an Alpine guide. Rocky areas with routes of different difficulties await.




Climb **Monte Carega**. An experience aimed at all trekking enthusiasts that want to learn to move safely, even on the most demanding paths.

Trip through the lands of Soave – East Verona

Take time to visit the hills and valleys of **East Verona**, the cradle of some of the most prized Italian wines, such as the ancient, fresh Soave. The hills extend as far as the eye can see, appearing like one large vineyard, all to explore!

Many small and large companies here follow the ancient winemaking tradition of these volcanic soils and are dedicated to preserving the landscape and its biodiversity.

A site you absolutely must see is **Soave Castle**. The marvellous trip to discover the lands of East Verona starts here.

Stop at the Museo Napoleonico in Arcole, a town known around the world for the battle that marked one of Napoleon Bonaparte's most important victories and also the end of the Republic of Venice.

Take a trip back in time and discover the places where fossils have been found. This is **Pesciara**, **just outside Bolca**, a deposit symbolizing Italian palaeontology.

An absolute must-see, a short ways from Soave, is the **Abbey of St Peter in San Bonifacio**. A magnificent expression of medieval architecture.


Of course, this is an area where it is impossible to get bored, among outdoor activities, such as mountain biking, trekking, and horse riding trips, or even tastings at wineries.





This area is famous for its **restaurants**, **trattorias**, **and inns** where you can taste typical dishes accompanied by good local wine.

From the prehistoric caves to the majestic villas of Veneto, from monumental gardens or simple rural courtyards to ancient Romanesque parish churches, Valpolicella unveils a unique and suggestive landscape.
